This guide provides information on where to dispose of household recycling, general waste and FOGO (Food Organics and Garden Organics) in the Shire of Augusta Margaret River.

Our community continues to reduce, reuse and recycle. Together we can reduce our environmental footprint to create a better, more sustainable future

It's easy to find a better place for unwanted items and reduce what we send to landfill.

Be a GREAT Sort...landfill is the last resort!



Putting your bins out for collection



Place bins out by 6am on your collection day



Maximum weight of each bin is 70ka



Do not park in front of bins and keep laneways clear







- Keep at least 0.5m clear between bins
- Keep at least 1m clear from trees and not under tree canopy
- Keep at least 1m clear of cars, mailboxes and fences etc.
- Overloaded bins will not be collected.

What can go into your recycling bin?

The items in your Recycling bin are sorted, baled and sold to be turned into new products.

Your efforts help recycle valuable resources.

- 1. Plastic
- 2. Glass
- 3. Cans
- 4. Paper
- 5. Cardboard

Nothing else, all these 5 and only these 5.



EASY RECYCLING RULES

- Only the 5
- Rinsed
- Loose in the bin
- · Lids off
- No plastic bags

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- No aerosols
- No soft plastic bags or packaging
- No batteries, eWaste or hazardous waste
- · No textiles, including clothing, strapping or rope
- No dirty containers
- No silver lined TetraPaks

These items contaminate the recycling.

Excess household recycling that is clean and free of all contaminants can be dropped off for free at the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility.

Eligible containers can be taken to a Containers for Change refund point.



Collected fortnightly

^All lids can be disposed of in your General Waste bin.

What can go into your FOGO bin?

The Food Organics and Garden Organics that go in your FOGO bin are Earth-cycled in the South West, to make certified organic compost.

Excess garden waste up to 2m³ can be taken to the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility for free, providing it is free of general waste and other contaminants.

COMPOSTABLE BIN LINERS ONLY

Look for these symbols:







Only compostable bin liners, complying with AS 4736 commercially compostable or AS 5810 home compostable are to be used in your FOGO bin. Alternatively, wrap your organics in paper bags, newspaper or paper towels.



ALL FOOD WASTE

Including meat, fish, bones and eggshells

USED PAPER PRODUCTS

Including paper towel, shredded paper, wet or dirty paper and cardboard (such as pizza boxes)

Collected weekly

What can go into your general waste bin?

Items put in this bin will be sent to landfill. The general waste bin should only be used for items that can't be recycled, composted or taken to a drop off point. Landfill is the last resort!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Do not place batteries, electronic waste, kitchen appliances, light globes, aerosols, chemicals, paint and flammable or hazardous items in any bin.

Some of these items can be dropped off at the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility or other drop off points (see page 10).

If you have household items in good condition you can drop these off for free at the Davis Road Tip Shop (at the discretion of the attendant), where they will be made available for resale.

Household Hazardous Waste, eWaste and other waste

eWaste and other waste

The Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility accepts the following for recycling or safe disposal:

- Aerosol cans
- Appliances, air conditioners and whitegoods*
- Asbestos (max 1 cubic metre)*
- Batteries (car)
- Batteries (household)
- Building materials*
- Cardboard
- · Co-mingled recycling
- · Computers, monitors, TV's, printers and cables
- Furniture and household items*
- Garden waste (Up to 2m³ for free)
- · Gas bottles; remove valve stems prior to drop off
- General household rubbish*
- Glass
- · Light globes and tubes
- Mattresses*
- Oil (motor only)
- Mobile phones and accessories

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Waste oil, vehicle batteries, metal and plastic chemical DrumMuster containers are accepted under our licence at Davis Road. All other Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) items must be taken to the Bunbury Harvey Regional Council in Australind, or look out for one of our Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Days.

Tip Shop

Have a browse through the Tip Shop and grab yourself a bargain. If you have items suitable for the tip shop let the gate attendants know on arrival.

Transfer Stations

Transfer stations are available for residents/ratepayers who do not have access to the kerbside collection service only. Domestic household waste, including recyclables can be dropped off at the following locations:

- Cowaramup Bay Road, Cowaramup
- Poole Road, Kudardup
- · Bessel Road, Rosa Brook
- Beck Road, Alexandra Bridge

Only residents with a Shire authorised smart card can access these facilities.

For access to these facilities, please contact the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility on 08 9780 5677.

Bulk waste items are not accepted at any transfer stations and must be brought to the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility for disposal or recovery.

Recyclables

FOGO

General waste

Take to a drop off centre



Aerosol cans. Take these to Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility or take to a Household Hazardous Waste drop off point



Asbestos Up to one cubic metre can be taken to the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility. Please call ahead (see page 11). Fees & charges apply.



Aluminium foil Clean and rolled into a tennis ball size.



Batteries Take household batteries to Shire offices in Augusta or Margaret River, Margaret River Library or Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility. Car batteries to Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility only.



Building material Treated timber, bricks and rubble. Take these to Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility.



Chemical containers (clean) Chemical containers and drums that have been rinsed clean can be dropped off at Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility for no charge through the DrumMuster Program.



Cling wrap refer to soft plastic packaging



Coffee cups Coffee cups are not recyclable. (Compostable coffee cups or PLA7 can go into FOGO).



Coffee grounds displaying the appropriate compostable symbol.



Compostable bags Do not put degradable or biodegradable plastic in the FOGO bin (it's still plastic and cannot be composted).



Cooking oil Soak small amounts in paper towel and place in FOGO.



Crockery Ceramic plates and cups, Pyrex and pots.




Electrical goods Take old computers, televisions, stereos, speakers, phones and peripherals to the Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility for no charge.




Gas bottles For LPG refills and disposals, return to your bottle supplier, or drop off empty bottles at Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility for no charge. Remove valve stem prior to disposal.



Light globes / Fluorescent Lamps and Tubes Take to Davis Road Recyling and Waste Management Facility.





Mobile phones Take to Augusta or Margaret River Shire offices,
Margaret River Library or Davis Road Recycling and Waste
Management Facility.

Motor oil Take to Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility.

Nappies and wipes Please do not flush any type of wipe or nappy down the toilet.

Paper towels Do not put in the recycling bin.

Pizza box Do not put in the recycling bin.

Plastic bags Please re-use plastic bags where possible then dispose

Plastic bottle tops and lids

Plastic items Such as straws, cutlery, broken toys, disposable party plates etc.

Printer cartridges Take to Margaret River Library, Margaret River Shire offices, Augusta News Agency, South West Computable Cowaramup.

Rope, hose, reticulation and plastic strapping
Cut into small pieces.

Shredded paper.

Soft plastic packaging Please re-use plastic bags where possible then dispose of them in your landfill bin with the red lid.

Stationery Take pens, markers, binders and presentation materials to Margaret River Library or participating schools.

Textiles / Fabric Or drop off at participating H&M or Zara stores or send via Upparel.

Treated timber Take to Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility. For large amounts please call ahead.

Tyres Take to Davis Road Recycling and Waste Management Facility

Tissues Do not put in the recycling bin.

(Fees & charges apply).

UHT containers Tetra Boxes / UHT containers cannot be recycled.
E.g. 11 long life juice, milk, plant-based milk and coconut water containers.
